

Club Championships

Liquor Licensing Regulations

The Club currently holds a full, unrestricted liquor licence, which enables us to purchase liquor products for sale from any registered liquor source, without restriction. We sell these products at agreed prices to recoup the purchase price and add an appropriate margin to cover operating costs and provide a profit to the Club.

Our defined registered "Red Area drinking" covers the entire WDTC club, inclusive of the area contained at the rear of the club, including sand pit area, full seated area above grass courts to fence, through to the entrance of the synthetic courts and the hall. No person is permitted to bring into the Red Area any alcohol products which have not been purchased from the bar. We do not and will not sell full bottles of hard alcohol products from the WDTC bar for consumption within our red areas.

All WDTC members, their friends and associates and Club hall hirers need to be aware that as the Club holds a full liquor licence, no-one is permitted to bring any alcohol products into the red area that have not been purchased at the WDTC bar. We also enforce the rule that any person over the age of 18 years cannot consume any liquor product that has not been purchased through the Club bar, for obvious reasons.

Hard liquor products are served in approved glass containers provided by the bar, in order to comply with the requirements of the responsible service of alcohol and our licence, an area in which bar staff are trained. The sale of alcohol in non-standard measures will not be allowed nor will any such drinks as "shooters", "slammers" etc. A copy of the liquor licensing rules is on the Club noticeboard.

There are heavy penalties for non-compliance of the licence regulations - up to \$10,000 for non-compliance, to the licensee, the Bar Manager and any trained bar person. Our policy of periodic reduced price drinks falls within the appropriate guidelines, with special care adopted when this does occur.

It was great for the players to experience on-court coaching and will play a significant part in their tennis development. Skye left the event with a 2/2 singles record and a 3/1 doubles record which was a great result. She is now the number 2 player in WA for her birth year and sits in the top 10 in Australia. COACHING TIP

The ball toss is a key component to a good serve. When the toss goes awry, so does the serve. A quick drill to check the location of the toss is to lay the racquet on the ground at an angle, in line with your front toe. Place your weight in your back leg. Cradle the ball with the thumb, index, and middle finger of your toss hand. As you shift your weight from the back to the front foot, toss the ball up, aiming for it to land in the middle of the racquet head. Give this a go and see how your ball toss is going! - Joe McCarthy, Master Club Professional
